John Newnham is Professor of Obstetrics at The University of Western Australia (UWA) and is a sub-specialist in Maternal Fetal Medicine. He is Head of the UWA Division of Obstetrics and Gynaecology based at King Edward Memorial Hospital and Chief Scientific Director of the Women and Infants Research Foundation.

His research interests focus on prevention of preterm birth and the early life origins of health and disease. He has initiated many clinical and laboratory research studies, including The Raine Study, the Western Australian Preterm Birth Prevention Initiative and more recently the Australian Preterm Birth Prevention Alliance.



He was awarded an Order of Australia in the general division in 2014.
